Things have surely changed in 2021, but for the better in many ways. People have come together as never before to show their support. We have met many new friends and forged partnerships with individual and group volunteers who help in so many ways with day-to-day operations of the House.



We've created bonds with families that will truly last a lifetime. One such family is the Saiz-Lopez family. Selena and Jose arrived at the House on April 14th when their preemie twins (Abraham and Elia) were just a few weeks old. Selena was grateful to the point of tears that they would have a safe and comfortable place to stay free of charge for as long as they needed to be here (140 nights)! The staff celebrated small victories and shared in their setbacks. Abraham arrived "home" several months later while Elia remained behind in the NICU. Elia was transferred to Texas Children's Hospital five months after arrival for a heart procedure.



Six weeks later they passed through Lubbock and stopped by with BOTH babies...healthy and flourishing.

Our House to Home Program is continuing to grow due to generous grants and is being well received by families.

It's been great to have the family rooms available! Volunteers staffing the family rooms are busier than ever putting together grab 'n go snack bags and personal care bags for families staying in the hospital. We are also showing our appreciation to the health care providers who work so tirelessly to care for patients. We received a generous donation of 30 queen Tempur-Pedic Mattresses which provide a great source of comfort for our families.

Many of our families come to us unexpectedly and have little with them. Vans Shoes donates children's and adult's on a regular basis.

Several quilting guilds continue to provide beautiful handmade quilts to us which we in turn include in welcome bags and distribute to children in the hospitals.



PALS Home Health provided us with personalized back packs which we fill with all of kinds of items that await families when they arrive.
