UMC Children's Emergency Center was built with children in mind to allow kids to feel comfortable and confident that they will get the best care possible. The dedicated pediatric staff have specialized education to provide the best care for little ones and work to increase that knowledge daily. There are so many things included in the UMC Children's EC to make the visit pass by with as little trauma as possible such as TVs with movies, game consoles, toys, fun staff, bright colors, and even a special reward "treat" machine. Even adults will want to spend time in the area.

UMC works hard to provide the highest standard of care as the only Level 1 Designated Trauma Center and the only burn center within 400 miles, and now the new UMC Children's Emergency center dedicated just for kids!

She and her family stayed at the Ronald McDonald House in Cleveland and have volunteered here in Lubbock. From the time children enter the EC to the time they get to leave, the area is meant to decrease their anxiety and help families know their children deserve the highest standard of care and a place that is extra special.

What does UMC Children's Emergency Center provide?

- Lobby dedicated only to pediatric patients
- 2 fast track/triage rooms
- 8 EC rooms just for kids
- 1 Procedure room
- Specialty trauma rooms
- Pediatric specific nurses
- Full-time dedicated child life support
- Imaging designed for kids including x-rays, ultrasound, CT scans and MRI

UMC Health System is also the only Children's Miracle Network (CMN) hospital in the region. Through CMN's community partners and individuals helping to support UMC Children's Hospital, UMC is proud to be able to provide this amazing Children's Emergency Center to our community.

Meet The Ogletree Family of Glen Rose, TX



On May 16, 2021, then 19 year old Texas Tech University student, Laura was experiencing significant pain which led her to go to University Medical Center for treatment. After testing, it was determined that she had blood clots in her legs and lungs. The scale of her emergency situation was moderate and she was admitted for treatment with medication.

Laura's family, residing in Glen Rose, Texas, rushed to Lubbock to be with her during this health crisis. Her father Doug, mother Joelle, and 16 year old sister Catherine were referred to Ronald McDonald House Charities of the Southwest and were registered to stay during Laura's medical journey.

On May 19th, Laura's 20th birthday, a surgical procedure was scheduled to remove clots not resolved with heparin treatment. During the surgery, Laura suffered a pulmonary embolism and coded. (A coded patient is one who is not breathing and/or has no pulse.)



For approximately an hour, Laura received CPR and was then placed on the highest level of life support medically available for several long days. With the knowledge that only the smallest percent of patients with similar conditions survive these events, they waited in uncertainty. After 7 days, Laura was taken off life support but remained in ICU. Doctors were surprised at her recovery, sometimes even calling it miraculous. On June 11th, she moved to an in-patient rehabilitation facility and then was released for out-patient rehabilitation and physical therapy on June 16th. The family remains at the Ronald McDonald House together as Laura continues with follow-up appointments and therapy.

"Every day gets a little easier and I'm feeling better all the time." Laura reports, "Now that I'm awake and able to think about things, I realize that I didn't know my family was staying at Ronald McDonald House at first but I'm so happy to know that they were so close. I didn't want them to have to be paying for a hotel all that time."

Joelle shared, "I had no idea how much our whole family need to be cared for as well. Since we were focusing on Laura, it was so nice to be emotionally cared for and supported here. I never knew how much it would mean to just be able to do laundry so we could have clean clothes. And having meals provided, real meals that are not fast food, has been so nice."

While Laura was still admitted at UMC, her parents took turns sitting with her. They would switch places around 2 A.M. each morning. Joelle said, "Being so close to the hospital and having the shuttle available to ride for our shift switch was so comforting. It made us feel so much safer."

"When I got the call from her mother that she was having the embolism, I was resting in our room at Ronald McDonald House. I was able to be dressed and by her side within five minutes." said Doug. "We've been at RMHC for a full month now. We are all surprised at how well she is recovering."

Laura feels her athletic background equipped her to work hard to make a full recovery. She's so glad that she completed her semester at TTU before her medical crisis.

The family states that they know being together through this difficult time made it much less stressful. RMHC is happy to serve the Ogletree family and many others each day.
